

## MASTER'S MESSAGE

Greetings, my Brethren. Our Lodge has had a very busy and profitable Winter and Spring, and we are looking forward to an equally fun summer and fall! The weather is warm, the Indians are winning – what's not to like?

Our award-winning LEO, RWB Mitchell L. Alperin (yes, he was given one of the 22<sup>nd</sup> District LEO Awards on Thursday, May 30<sup>th</sup> at the District Awards Night) gave a program recently in our Lodge that dealt with Lodge decorum: how we behave in Lodge, how we conduct discussions, how we treat each other as Brethren. One of the issues that also came up for discussion was that of what to wear to Lodge; Forest City's 'dress code', if you will.

There are times when it is important that we dress differently than usual. Choirs wear robes, marching bands wear plumed hats, clergy wear prayer shawls and scapulars. In so doing, we set both ourselves and the occasion apart from our normal, everyday activities. The change in our clothing brings a change in our attitude, and puts us – ideally – into a more spiritual, mystical mood. That is why it has long been required of the officers of Forest City Lodge that they wear a tuxedo to the meetings, unless otherwise specified. Similarly, it has been assumed that the members will wear coat-and-tie when they attend meetings, as a matter of respect to the Lodge and to the other Brethren.

And yet...

I was recently at a social gathering where many of the attendees were Brethren of the Lodge. One of the Brethren – whom I know only slightly, but who has been a member of our Lodge for several decades – was explaining to me why he doesn't come to Lodge. "I work late," he said, "and my workplace is quite a ways from Lodge, and I wear work clothes. I don't have time to go home and change, and still make it back to Lodge, and I don't feel like carrying a suit and tie around with me in my work truck while I'm making calls. So, I don't come to Lodge. Maybe after I retire..."

I didn't think fast enough to quote to him the portion of the EA Lecture which alludes to the internal aspects that Masonry regards, but I said to him, "Look, my Brother – and you are just that, we are all just Brothers, regardless of title – anytime you want to come to Lodge, and you have a valid dues card in your wallet, **YOU JUST COME TO LODGE!** And when you come into that Lodge room, you sit right down in front. I'd rather see you there in your work clothes, than have an empty seat with an Armani-tailored suit draped over it."

We have been talking all year long about both the importance of maintaining the traditions of our 145-year-old Lodge, and the necessity of adapting those traditions to a changing world.

Social standards and customs have changed since the founding of Forest City Lodge #388. When we come to Lodge now, we do not dress in the style of clothing that our Brethren wore in 1867; we have changed the style to fit the times, and have done so several times over the years. If our Lodge is to remain alive in this new era, we need to examine some of our cherished ideas and attitudes. To uphold tradition is a laudable thing – unless and until the traditional ties that bind us become the noose that strangles us. To the extent that our traditions are a beacon that attracts good men and true – uphold them. To the extent that they drive away members and diminish attendance – maybe we need to re-think them.

Recently, on May 29<sup>th</sup>, we had the pleasure of seeing Brother William Zeligson raised to the sublime Degree and of having his Grandfather, Dan Zeligson, act as Senior Deacon for the Degree, and his father, Ron Zeligson, fly in from out of town to witness the ceremony. The Lodge that grandfather Dan came into nearly 50 years ago is different than the one he sat in this past week, and the Lodge that William has joined will likely be even more different in years to come. For William to continue to have a Lodge, we must both maintain our traditional Lodge, and adapt our Lodge to a changing world where the tenets of Freemasonry are needed, perhaps more now than ever before.


Also, please keep your Lodge Secretary informed of address changes, or other changes in living arrangements, so that our records can be as accurate as possible.



Also, Brother Elliott Gross was able to give his son the Fellowcraft charge. It was a great feeling to see my son and a former student become my brothers. Again, I thank all of the brethren who participated in the three degrees, and especially to those from Forest City who performed an excellent Fellowcraft Degree for the 22nd District to view at the Masonic Auditorium downtown.

As we finish up our labors in preparation for the summer recess, with Table Lodge on June 19th, we now have nine new enthusiastic members who have either been raised or pluraled in May, and we look forward to seeing a few more raised in the fall when we return. Let us welcome these new brethren, and show them all the hospitality that Forest City Lodge can bestow, and let us show them how to be good Masons by our example. They are the future of our Lodge, and deserve the chance to become better men, just as we have grown and achieved in our time with Forest City Lodge, and continue to do so.
