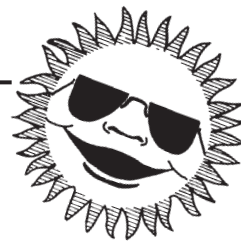

## OUR ART

“Clouds come floating into my life, no longer to carry rain or usher storm, but to add color to my sunset sky”

*19<sup>th</sup> century poet and Nobel prize winner*  
**Rabindranath Tagore**

On the first and third Wednesdays of every month, a group of artists convene at a temple on Mayfield Road in Lyndhurst, Ohio. They all have their own distinct style, as with all artists. And, as with all artists, no two will ever be the same; but no one could be great without first learning from and drawing inspiration from others. Monet took his first drawing lessons from Jacques-François Ocharde, who was first taught by Jacques-Louis David. Picasso honed his skills when his father took a position at the Barcelona school of fine arts and persuaded them to admit his son.

Inspiration can quite often come in forms that we do not see. Sometimes we are the ones who choose not to see what can be right in front of our faces. Sometimes we can take criticism as negative because we do not like the way it was said. Sometimes we throw out the baby with the bath water. Sometimes we overlook the positive that we could gain, and the way we could adjust ourselves to be better men, because of a personal grudge, a dislike for another artist's style of giving it, or our own stubbornness to change. It is normal to be defensive, in the beginning, to criticism. It can be said that a measure of a man is how fast he can get over his own guard and step back, take a look at what was said, and look for the positive within it while overlooking a delivery that may have offended. Nobody will ever be you, nobody will ever look at everything exactly the same as you; it is unrealistic to think they would, and rude of you to ask them to do so. The men in our beautiful Masonic Lodge are great; they are very happy with their core principles. They have become who they are through their life experiences.

As artists, we should be inspired to be surrounded by men who are hard-working, accomplished, and different than us. You will never learn anything by having conversations with those who agree with you. As in business also, surrounding yourself with a bunch of “yes” men can be more dangerous than dissenting opinions. The great President Abraham Lincoln, when making up his cabinet, appointed former political rivals William Henry Seward as his Secretary of State, and Salmon P. Chase as his Secretary of Treasury. He understood the importance of difference. We should be extremely proud of the art we create on a bi-monthly basis. People travel around the world to Paris, London, New York, and now to Cleveland to see art that has influenced the world. Not to downplay what the men and women in those museums have done, but our art has changed the world more than

any other. Throughout our existence, our art has touched so many lives, inspired so much greatness, and changed an uncountable number of lives, both within the fraternity and outside it. We should all take great pride in what we do, and show it at every meeting.

Before every meeting, there is an overlooked ritual that, as all great artists have done, we all take part in: we sign our art. There is a ledger that all guests and members put their mark on. This is not there just to take attendance, but is there for all of us to proudly proclaim, “I was here, I contributed to our beauty.” Next time you sign the work of art that you are working on that day, take into account the wonderfulness that you are creating, and do not just scribble something in the ledger. Instead, take pride in your mark so that future generations can look back, see who was there, and draw inspiration from what you did that day, and help themselves work on being a better artist.

### Global Fraternal Network

Worshipful Brother Ellis T. Mills, a past master of Star Lodge No. 187 in Cuyahoga Falls, has been a regular visitor to Forest City Lodge. He also serves as Editor of “*GFN CYBERMASON*”, the newsletter of the Global Fraternal Network, as well as being the holder of other significant titles, including Knight of the York Cross of Honor.

About 1994, the Global Fraternal Network (GFN) was created by **R.W.B. Richard A. Newman and R.W.B. Jean Rene van Geuns, Past District Deputy Grand Masters of the Grand Lodge of the State of New York**. It was directed and guided by Members of the Grand Lodge of New York and meant to reach and accommodate local Brothers. The late Grand Master Sheldon Blank and M.W.B. Gary Henningsen were the first in a long line of Grand Masters to this day, that have encouraged and guided the Founders of the GFN to where it is now. Today, the GFN has developed into a password-controlled Global Communications Network with thousands of Masonic Brethren from all over the world subscribing to its Masonic principles. There are no dues, and passing a simple examination will get you admission. The GFN provides an opportunity to “talk” with brethren from around the world. It affords an excellent opportunity to exchange ideas and to learn how our Fraternity functions in other countries, as well as in different jurisdictions here in the United States.

## FROM THE WEST

Greetings, Brethren – as many of you know, I am very active in the world of classical music in Cleveland. Music is one of the Seven Liberal Arts, and it is placed almost at the top. Music is the link, the bridge, between Geometry (the things of the Earth) and Astronomy (the things of Heaven), but that is another topic for another time...

Recently, I had the pleasure of attending a concert performed by the Ohio Philharmonic Orchestra. The Music Director, the leader, of this regionally-acclaimed ensemble is a young man who is a Brother Mason, Domenico Boyagian. He is rapidly building a name for himself as a conductor in America, Canada, and in Europe.

Over the years, I have been lucky enough – blessed enough – to sing for many well-known conductors. I mention this as a way to say that when I speak of our Brother Domenico Boyagian as being one of the best, I do (for a change) have some personal, professional, and musical knowledge whereof I speak.

The Ohio Philharmonic is not The Cleveland Orchestra – nothing else in the entire world approaches The Cleveland – but they are a dedicated group of skilled musicians. Most of them are paid professionals, some are volunteers, but all of them give of themselves for the benefit of the Music, far beyond anything that they might make in salary. Doesn't that sound to you like a Masonic Lodge: a dedicated group of skilled craftsmen, mostly volunteers, who give of themselves, above and beyond?

In hearing this live performance by the Ohio Philharmonic, and watching Brother Domenico interact with his musicians in his orchestra, and hearing the music that they produced under his baton and with his direction, I saw the eye contact he made with so many of the 75-or-so musicians on the stage. I saw how much personal interaction there was, how many subtle inside jokes were shared, how they knew what he expected of them in any given passage, and how beautifully they rose to the occasion.

They did so only partially because Domenico's personal and professional musical standards demanded it of them – much more so because they WANTED to. For the music, for the Orchestra, for the audience, for Domenico, and lastly, for themselves – they so much WANTED to make this work. And the end result sounded much better than anyone really had any right to expect.

For another example, the most common comments made about legendary American Choral Conductor Robert Shaw, who chose to spend much of his professional time working with volunteer choruses, could be summarized/synthesized as this: “Robert Shaw reached down inside me, and brought things out of me that even I didn't know were there. I didn't know that I could sing as well as I sang for Shaw. He changed me – he made me better because he showed me that I could be better, and taught me how to be better, and he both demanded that I be better, and always encouraged me to be better, than anything that I thought I could ever be.”

Isn't that what our Fraternity, and our participation in attending Lodge meetings, is supposed to do for us as Brothers? Aren't we supposed to come to the meetings the mere men that we are and—after meeting with and enjoying the companionship of our Brothers—leave as better men than we thought we could be?

Brother Domenico Boyagian brought his people of the Ohio Philharmonic Orchestra TOGETHER on that occasion. They did what they were supposed to do – they made people who were there with them feel better, feel stronger, feel more empowered to go back out of that auditorium, that 'sacred' musical space, that Lodge of Music (if you will), and re-enter the profane world, with a renewed dedication to the collective purpose of Doing Better.

This is what our Lodge, and our Fraternity, can do, both for us, and for our families, our communities, our nation, and our world. Freemasonry's goal is to make good men better, just as Brother Domenico Boyagian makes his good players better. If we come TOGETHER, if we attend meetings, if we work with each other as Brothers and friends – who knows where we may be led, or what lofty goals we may accomplish?

Brother Domenico is acknowledged as the Music Director, the leader of his orchestra, just as the Master is the leader of his Lodge. However, it is an essential part of Domenico's leadership quality that he will be the first to say that it was not him alone that made the concert, but his Orchestra – TOGETHER! I look forward to the Brethren of Forest City Lodge coming together, at our meetings and at our social events, and moving forward in the joy of our Brotherhood in Freemasonry, as Brothers of our Lodge, and for the accomplishment of our Masonic goals.
