
MASONIC FUNERAL SERVICES

MUSINGS FROM THE SOUTH

Those who attend Lodge this year have noticed beautiful banners adorning the podiums of the Worshipful Master, Senior and Junior Wardens. They are a gift to the lodge from W.B. Franck Kakou. The banners are respectively white, red, and blue for the three principal officers of the Lodge, and are designated as wisdom, strength, and beauty. These stations are considered to be the three pillars of the Lodge, as the officers who attend them are primarily responsible for its support.

Upon our installation this year, following an explanation of the duties of each station, the three symbolic colors were mentioned along with their symbolism. The color white is emblematic of Innocence, Peace, and Wisdom. Color red denotes Strength, Zeal, Virtue, and Love. Color blue refers to Beauty, Fidelity, Eternity, Friendship, and Divine Truth.

The Worshipful Master represents wisdom, as he must govern his Lodge wisely to the benefit of all the members thereof. He must have the peace of mind to be confident that his decisions, once made, as well as innocence to know that his choices are never driven by negative motives.

The Senior Warden represents strength, as he is oftentimes required to assist the Master in running the Lodge. While the Master is responsible for opening the day's business, the Senior Warden's duty is to close the day. For him, zeal is the force which hopefully will propel him into the office of Wor. Master; virtue is the devotion that he shows to his fellow officers; and love is his gift to the Lodge as he is called upon to maintain harmony and support.

The Junior Warden represents Beauty, as he is the one responsible to conduct the Lodge during the noon hour when the sun is at its zenith. Fidelity is the Junior Warden's due to all the brethren through duty and truth. Eternity, as with the acacia, refers to the immortality of the spirit. Friendship is most evident as he acts as a bridge between the craft and the officers, while divine truth is demonstrated in this officer's devotion to the living word.

Beauty, Strength, and Wisdom are also said to be closely aligned to the three degrees. The E.A. represents the beauty of youth; the F.C. alludes to the strength of middle age; the M.M. pays homage to the wisdom of age. These qualities may not always be present, but certain traits are more prevalent at certain times. We strive for these qualities in our lives, but though beauty may be natural at first, and strength may quickly develop behind, wisdom comes late – if at all.

As I sit at the Pillar of Beauty, I thank my brethren for the honor of serving in this responsible position. It has been my pleasure to participate in ceremonies of Brotherhood, the three (3) degrees, as well as the 'typewritten' ritual. This is also a year of planning, because if the brethren deem me worthy in two years, my plans must be well-thought out and complete.

My thanks to all who are rendering me their organizational wisdom so that I may successfully face any and all challenges that may arise as I move up the officer line. I look forward, eagerly, to continue to serve OUR Lodge, and I hope to meet each of you in YOUR Lodge – soon.

FREEMASONRY and the AMERICAN REVOLUTION

Part 2, taken from ElectricScotland.com – "Scots and Freemasonry" by Carson C. Smith, FSA Scot

Does Freemasonry have anything to do with the American War of Independence?

WELL,

George Washington was a Mason. On the night he crossed the Delaware, he insisted that only Masons be posted as sentries, because they were the only soldiers he felt could be trusted. He served as Master of his lodge in Alexandria, VA. At the laying of the cornerstone of our Nation's Capitol, Washington wore his Masonic apron.

Benjamin Franklin was a Mason. He was selected to serve on the committee which drafted the Declaration of Independence, and was one of nine (9) Masons to sign it.

John Hancock was a Mason. He was the President of the Continental Congress which approved the Declaration of Independence, and was the first of the nine Masons to sign it.

Patrick Henry was a Mason. He, too, a member of the Continental Congress, is credited with spurring the formation of the Virginia militia with his speech at St. John's Church in which he declared, "Give me liberty or give me death".

John Paul Jones was a Mason. He was a Scottish born seaman and privateer (a polite term for a pirate), who was to become "The Father of the United States Navy".

Major General Henry Knox was a Mason. He was the owner of a book shop. He learned about cannons and mortars from the books he read, and became "The Father of the United States Artillery".

Marquis de Lafayette was a Mason. He was the French nobleman and soldier who became a great supporter of his friend AND Brother, George Washington.

Major General Israel Putnam was a Mason. He commanded the troops at Bunker Hill, and is remembered for his order, "Don't fire until you see the

whites of their eyes!".

Paul Revere was a Mason. He was a member of St. Andrew's Lodge in Boston, MA., where he met John Hancock and Samuel Adams. He acted as one of the "indians" in the Boston Tea Party, and is credited with the famous midnight ride of April 18, 1775.

Does Freemasonry have anything to do with the American War of Independence? Yes!!! It has everything to do with it, and with the struggle for freedom and equality for men and women of every race, religion, and creed throughout the World, and that vision of liberty and justice for all is the New World Order for which we are striving – to this very day.
