Operative Masonry

All about monuments – Final Segment

When selecting a monument, remember that it is the only purchase you will ever make that is designed to last forever. It must look just as beautiful 50 or 100 years from now when our children's children come to see it. All stones are not the same. Some retain their appearance, and others darken and discolor.

Another important consideration is craftsmanship. Lettering should be an integral part of the memorial, and should fit into the lifestyle and feeling of the design. Just as one selects a trained lawyer to work on an estate planning, the services of a trained professional to create a lasting tribute for a loved one is essential. He or she should be a member of "Monument Builders of North America and Certified Memorialist" - such retailers are the highest professionals in this field.

Finally, because Cleveland is in a cold weather climate, we have to deal with constant temperature change as well as modern air pollutions. To maintain the original beauty of a granite memorial, occasional cleaning is recommended. Our industry recommends using a mix of bicarbonate of soda and water. This is just as effective as more expensive neutralizers. This application will bring out the natural beauty of the granite, and will preserve the endurance.



Masons Love Our Country With All Their Soul and With All Their Might

Bro. Daniel Neal Heller – 1924-2008

Bro. Daniel Heller (not a member of Forest City Lodge), the National Commander of the Jewish War Veterans of the USA from 1963-64 died at the age of 83 in his Miami, FL home. **He was a 32nd degree Mason and a member of the Shrine.**

Bro. Heller served our country during WWII aboard an aircraft carrier as a member of the U.S. Navy. A practicing attorney for many years in Miami, Bro. Heller was also extremely active in civic affairs. As National Commander of the Jewish War Veterans of America, he marched in President John F. Kennedy's funeral procession, and both he and his wife stood behind French President Charles de Gaulle at JFK's Arlington National Cemetery burial.


In 1964, Bro. Heller had an audience with Pope Paul VI to discuss anti-Semitism in the Soviet Union, during which the Pope said he sympathized with and would pray for Oppressed Jews. During his term as National Commander, Bro. Heller urged all Jewish War Veterans posts to support the racial equality goals advocated by the Kennedy administration.

Bro. Heller was indeed a true Mason and a living example of the goals of our Great Fraternity.
