Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart one-fourth of a millennium

Our own Past Master Mitchell L. Alperin, during his year (2000) as Worshipful Master of our lodge, oftentimes spoke of taking Forest City Lodge into the next millennium. Mitchell is also a patron of classical music, and during his year and several succeeding seasons, he arranged for a Forest City Lodge "Night with the Cleveland Orchestra".

How coincidental is it, that this year the world is celebrating the 250th anniversary (one-fourth of a millennium) of the birth of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, one of the greatest, if not the greatest, classical music composer that the world has ever known.

Unknown to most of us, however, is that Mozart was a member of the Craft, a FreeMason. Even before becoming a Mason, he composed in 1772, his 1st Masonic work, "Ode to a solemn Saint Johns lodge". The following year he composed a 2nd masonry-related work, "Thamos, King of Egypt".

Not too much else is known about Mozart and Masonry. What we do know was gleaned from the 'lodge minutes' of several lodges in Austria. He was initiated an Apprentice on December 14, 1784 in a Viennese Lodge, "Zur Wohtätigkeit'. Several weeks later, on January 7, 1785, the "Ceremony of Passing" occurred in another lodge, "Zur wahren Eintracht".

Somewhere between the above two dates and April 22, 1786, Mozart must have been Raised to Master Mason, because he was present as such during the initiating of his father, Leopold, in the lodge, "Zur Neugerkrönte Hoffnung". What a brilliant and masterful craftsman was our late Bro. Mozart.

Our information about Mozart and Masonry comes from writings of Ard Renaud, a member of "Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart" Lodge #237 in Hilversum, The Netherlands. To learn more of Mozart, and to listen to some of his magnificent music, go online to search, then type in: Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and FreeMasonry.

To Aspiring Lodge Officers:

Beware the "itis" affliction

All of us are familiar with diseases such as bronchitis, arthritis, laryngitis, and others. These are often found among either children, adults, or senior citizens. Usually a trip to the drug store, or in severe cases a visit to the doctor relieves the discomfort.

In Masonry, there is an "itis" which is often very hurtful to young aspiring lodge officers, but which afflicts Past Masters **ONLY**. It is known as "inmyyearitis", and it usually starts to fester after a Past Master is out-of-office for at least 2-3 years. With each passing year, the disease grows in intensity.

It most often breaks out at Past Masters' meetings when line officers are called to task for missing (or being late to) a meeting, or for errors in ritualistic work, or for their quality (or lack thereof) of floorwork, or for a myriad of other tasks which officers are supposed to learn as they proceed 'thru the chairs'. One Past Master will remark, "in my year" we did such and such. Another will chime in, "in my year" things were done just so. This goes on and on.

The problem with "inmyyearitis" is that it affects the memories of Past Masters. They forget that they made many of the same mistakes in 'opening lodge', or 'conferring a degree', and giving a 'lecture or charge', that the new, young officers are now doing. What makes it worse, though, is that with each passing year, 'inmyyearitis' causes the mistakes of the past to become smaller and smaller until the Past Master truly believes that everything in his year was **perfect** and **above reproach. NOT SO!!**

Officers, TAKE NOTE: study, watch, listen. To make a mistake is normal and human. To try, however, to fake your way through the required work is a 'no-no'. Most of your brethren can discern when an officer knows the work but makes an error. They also know when someone is ill-prepared because the proof 'is in the pudding'. Someday, with the help of the Great Architect, you will become Past Masters. Try to avoid "inmyearitis".
