Making Brotherly Love a Reality

For those who may be unaware, I will be absent from Brotherhood Night '2006'. Instead I will be spreading the tenets of our Fraternity which have been the cornerstone of Freemasonry since its inception.

I shall be joining a team of optometrists, opticians, technicians, and volunteers, who will set up a temporary optical clinic in Mexico to hand-deliver free eye care and used eyeglasses to approximately 20,000 needy people during a two-week mission.

I am nervous and excited as I look forward to assisting the less advantaged receive The 'Gift of Sight'. I can only imagine the jubilation as I watch the joy of a child as he or she sees the leaves on a tree for the 1st time; or as I witness an infant getting its 1st look at its mother's face.

Our group will be asked to work long, hard hours at the clinic, but I'm certain that my feelings at helping those 'less fortunate than ourselves' will be worth the effort. Those who have been a part of previous missions tell me that the experience will change my live forever.

Getting selected to go on this mission was no easy task. Actually, it was my 3rd attempt, and I truly believe that my undertakings as a Mason was a factor in my selection. I had to write an essay about my qualifications, and I truly believe that my references to Masonic principals and teachings carried

significant weight. Perhaps the fact that our new headquarters is located in Mason, Ohio was a sign from G-d that 2006 was to be my year.

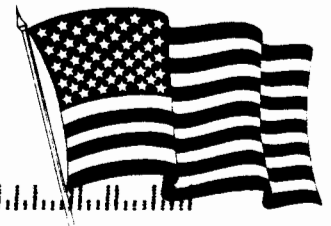
